## 1ST TEAM ON THE MARCH

In the face of challenges, Kieran Smith and I were resolute in our mission to rejuvenate Winscombe AFC's first team, aiming to unite the club and reignite the passion for the game after challenging seasons.

From a meagre 7 players in our initial training session, the collaborative efforts between Kieran, Jory , Simon, and myself were often intense, but the hard work paid off.

Overcoming a shaky start with 11 goals conceded in the first two games, the return of Mike Hosey and Cal Murray, alongside the emergence of talents like James Tait and the youthful energy of Tim Stoves, significantly bolstered the team.

Individual brilliance has illuminated the squad, contributing to a renewed sense of positivity within the club. Cal Murray's heroics in penalty shootouts have propelled us into the semi-finals of two out of three league cups, showcasing the team's resilience.

Our decision to appoint Jory as team captain has proved fruitful, with his leadership both on and off the pitch, evident in his role as the top goal scorer with 12 goals this season.



As we eye cup semi-finals and potential promotion, the anticipation of an open-top bus tour through the village this summer signifies the positive trajectory we've set for Winscombe AFC.

## **NEW YEAR - NEW NAME!**

At the Cricket Club's recent AGM it was agreed that the clubhouse, formerly known as "The Cricket Club", would be renamed "Winscombe Sports & Social Club" to greater reflect the usage of the building. This is a fantastic step forward in recognising how the sports clubs are working together for the good of all.

For those readers that are not aware of the history of the building and land at the Recreation Ground I will give a brief run through of how the ownership and use of the village assets works.

The Recreation Ground is held in trust and managed by the Parish Council for use solely for sporting or recreational purposes. The Football Club has use of the land on an annual agreement that has existed since the Club was formed. The Changing Rooms are jointly owned with the cricket and rugby clubs on a long term lease from the Parish Council. The clubhouse is owned by the cricket club under a long term lease from the Parish Council. The cricket club is run as a members club and anyone over the age of 18 that uses the facility must become a member of the club, at the current cost of £10 per year. All surplus income from the bar or hiring of the facilities is put back into the upkeep or improvements to the building. You will soon see a sign over the building's entrance reflecting the change.

Sean joined the club in 2021. Like most of (if not all!) the managers in the junior section, he started on the sidelines watching as a parent. An initial offer to help 'herd' a small group of 6 year olds, including his son, very quickly led to him becoming the U7 (now U9s) Manager. His focus has always been on getting a match for everyone who wants to play each week (weather-permitting!) and helping the players grow as footballers and young people through an enjoyment of the game.

At the start 2023, Sean was approached by his daughter, who was playing with the U11 mixed team at the time, about setting up a Girls team. Riding the wave of our Lionesses winning the Euros, he set about seeing if there was any interest in the area...and was blown away. Within a matter of weeks, the club's first ever Girls Team was formed...a proud moment for the club and a fitting way to cap off the club's Centenary season.

Sean was appointed Heads of Girls Football in 2023, and immediately set about starting more girls teams in the younger age groups and is to say that a year on, there are now over 70 girls playing at the club across three teams from minis to U12s. This is due to the effort of numerous existing coaches at the club chipping in and helping to put sessions on and, most importantly, an incredible group of new coaches now managing the teams.

Sean also plays for the club's Vets team, although he'd like to remind his U9s to "do as he says, not as he does!".

Away from the club, Sean is a passionate Liverpool supporter and has followed them across the country and Europe and likes to make the most of living so close to the Thatchers Farm!



The U10's Girls squad had an amazing experience being mascots for Bristol Rovers WFC. This was such an incredible day for the girls and it will be something that we remember for a long time.

We took 19 girls over for a top of the table clash against Sherborne Town Ladies. Before the game we got to meet the Gas Girls, getting photos signed and speaking to the players in the changing room. We then had our own football session out on the pitch, playing some small sided games and finishing with a penalty shootout, right next to the Rovers players as they were warming up.







The U10's then lined up in the tunnel ready to walk out with the Bristol Rovers team. You can see in the photos how much they enjoyed this opportunity, and the girls were fantastic throughout the whole day – getting stuck in during their training session, chatting with the players and cheering them on against Sherborne. We definitely picked a good game to watch with Rovers winning 5–1!

This will have been a real inspiration for the Winscombe players and will only increase their enthusiasm for football.

#### **Q. WHAT IS YOUR FOOTBALL BACKGROUND?**

I had an unorthodox football journey. I didn't start the sport until late joining Milton Nomads FC at U1O age group, but I found playing with established footballers difficult and unfortunately stopped after one season.

I didn't return to playing competitive football (outside of playing for my school) until I joined Worle JFC at U15 level. Saturday work commitments made it difficult to commit to the team so in 1997 I joined the team my father, Graham Booth, played for in the Weston Sunday League. This team disbanded at the end of the season!

A year later, I joined a newly formed side, Sporting Weston FC. In 2004 I became the club's Secretary and have continued to play and run it ever since. I have predominantly played in the Weston and District League, but in 2003 I did have a season playing for Langford Rovers in the Premiership Division of the Somerset County League.

Aged 43, this season will be my last playing competitive Saturday football and I look forward to instead concentrating on Winscombe and coaching our U6's.
